

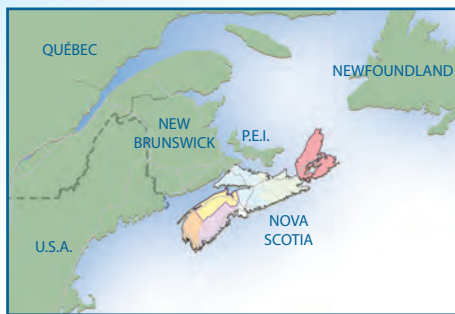


Birthplace of Hockey

Windsor, founded in 1759 and incorporated as a Town in 1878, is part of the Avon Region of Nova Scotia and often referred to as the “Gateway to the Valley”. It is recognized nationally and internationally as the “Birthplace of Hockey”. Historical evidence shows that the game known as ice hockey had its humble origins circa 1800 on Long Pond in Windsor, a global Mecca for hockey fans.



Windsor is located within 30 minutes of Halifax and is served by Halifax Stanfield International Airport and the Port of Halifax – both within 45 minutes from Windsor.

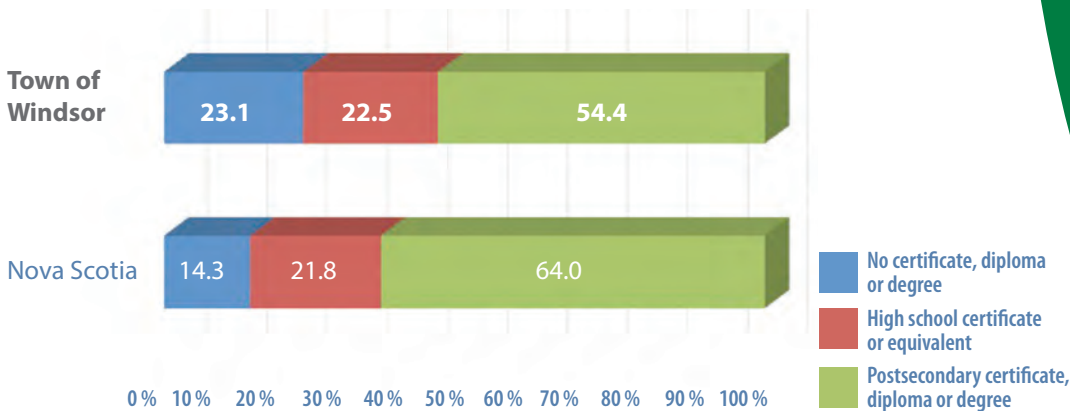
